Course Description

This course is the first introduction to rigorous mathematical proofs. We will use familiar notions of a set, relation and function, and playing games to learn how mathematical statements come to be, how to guess a conjecture, how to prove a conjecture to make it a theorem, or how to find a counterexample to show that our conjecture needs to be corrected.

Homework

There will be 10 assignments due on Tuesdays by 11:59pm on dates indicated on Canvas in Assignments. Your work will be corrected directly there for you to see comments and your points will be recorded in Grades. The lowest score will be dropped and you can submit 3 days late once (that is, by Friday 11:59pm) without any reason. Otherwise, late submission will not be accepted unless there is a well documented reason to do so.

Quizzes

There will be three quizzes during the usual class meeting time. Quizzes will be closed book with no notes. Make-up quizzes need to be substantiated and will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Final Exam

The final exam date will be at the prescribed date.

Presentation

Students will give group presentations based on material introduced during class. Each presentation will last approximately 25 minutes, with each student expected to present for five minutes or so.
