For example, a grade of 86% would be a B+, because it meets the B+ requirement, but does not meet the A- requirement.

A grade of 77% would be equivalent to a B-.

To download Honorlock

1. Open the Chrome browser and navigate to a Canvas course site that is using Honorlock.
2. On the left-hand menu, click "Honorlock."
3. An "Honorlock Chrome Extension" window will pop up. Check the "I agree..." box and click the blue "get started" button.

4. A tab with the Chrome Web Store will open. Click the blue “add to Chrome” button.
5. Click the “add extension” button. You will receive a confirmation message that the extension has been added.
