Text: Fundamentals of Differential Equations, 9th Edition, by Nagle, Saff, and Snider

**Course Description:** We will cover most of Chapters 8, 9, and 10 from the text. Topics will include power series methods, matrix methods for systems, introduction to partial differential equations, and Fourier series

**Prerequisites:** MAP 2302 is required. A course in linear algebra (MAS 3114 or MAS4105) would be helpful, but we will cover the necessary material in class.

**Homework:** Homework will be assigned regularly but not collected or graded. Time will be set aside in class to discuss homework problems. Exam problems will be close in material to moderately difficult homework problems. If I find that people aren't doing their homework I will institute weekly quizzes containing homework problems.

**Exams**: There will be three 50 minute exams. They will take place Friday, Feb. 15, Friday, March 29, and Tuesday, April 30 at 3:00 pm. This last date is in the Final Exam slot designated for this class by the university and cannot be changed.

**Grades:** The three exams are weighted equally. The grade ranges are 90-100% A, 80-90% B, 70-80% C, 60-70% D, <60% F with pluses and minuses at each end.

**Announcements:** You are responsible for all announcements made in class which could include changes in exam dates and material covered.

**Class Attendance:** Most students benefit a great deal from attending class regularly. Arriving late and/or leaving early, reading the newspaper, looking at your cell phone, etc. disrupts the class and is rude and unprofessional.

**Excused Absences:** In certain circumstances a student will be able to make up a missed exam. These circumstances could include medical situations, family emergencies, travel for University activities (eg. band, debating club, etc), and religious observances.
