ATTENDANCE

EXAMS

- There will be three In Class Exams (Feb. 5th, March 12th, April 16). Each Exam will have a Multiple Choice section worth 100 points and a Free Response section worth 100 points. Add these two scores together to determine your grade out of 200 points.
- Students are responsible for material covered in the lectures, including problems or examples in the lecture note outlines that we may not have had time to work out during the lectures, and all assigned homework problems.
- You should bring to exams only your UF Gator One Card and soft lead pencils. Please, keep in mind that you will not be able to take items such as backpacks to your seats, so it is suggested that you do not bring anything of value to the exam.
- No calculators or other aids are permitted for use during the exams.

IN CLASS QUIZZES

- There will be three In Class Quizzes, each worth 50 points. A Quiz will consist of one or two questions and will be given in the last 10 minutes of class.
- Students not present at the beginning of class will not be allowed to take the Quiz.
- No calculators or other aids are permitted for use during the Quiz.

TAKE HOME QUIZZES

- There will be three Take Home Quizzes, each worth 50 points. The Quiz will consist of one or two questions and will be handed out at the end of class. The Quiz will be due at the start of the next class.
- Students not present at the beginning of class will not be allowed to take the Quiz.
- Students should not discuss Take Home Quizzes with each other, as this constitutes cheating.

HOMEWORKS

- Homework will be collected three times during the semester at the beginning of class (Feb. 5th, March 12th, April 16). The exact assignments due will be announced in class and posted on the course website.
- Two questions will be chosen randomly and will be graded out of 10 points. I will also award 5 points for neatness, completeness, and overall excellence. Thus, each Homework assignment is worth 25 points.
- **COPYING** another student's Homework is **CHEATING**. Students are permitted to discuss the Homework with other students, but should only share ideas, **NOT SOLUTIONS**.

ATTENDANCE

- Attendance will be taken randomly 5 times throughout the semester. Each Attendance quiz is worth 5 points for a total of 25 points.
- To be counted present, students are expected to be in their seats at the start of class, and to remain in their seats until the end of class.

- Students caught sleeping, playing with cell phones, or talking during class will be counted as absent.

FINAL EXAM

- The Final Exam will be optional, and can take the place of your lowest Exam score. If you choose not to take the Final Exam, then your grade will be determined by your first 3 Exams and your quizzes, homeworks, and attendance.
- The date and time of the Final Exam will be announced in class and will be posted on the course website.
- The Final Exam is cumulative and has a Multiple Choice section worth 100 points and a Free Response Section worth 100 points.
- No calculators or other aids are permitted for use during the Final Exam.
