Text: Calculus: Early Transcendentals, 8th edition, James Stewart, (note: an e-version of the book is included in the purchase of online homework)

Grades: A student's grade will be based upon online group assignments (WebAssign), quizzes, and exams in accordance with the table below.

Online Homework: Homework will be assigned through WebAssign. The procedure for registering for WebAssign has changed. This information can be found under the Start Here module. During the course of the semester, online homeworks will be assigned on a routine basis and must be completed within the given time interval. There will be no extensions for WebAssign for any reason; instead 50 points will be dropped at the end of the semester.

Quizzes: There will be eleven quizzes given throughout the semester. The quizzes must be taken at the time given in the course calendar. The student will have 30 minutes to take each online quiz (the quizzes will be on Canvas) and is free to use their notes. Quizzes are not group projects and students are expected to work individually on these assignments. The dates and times for the quizzes are given in the course calendar. Students will have a 24 hour period to begin a quiz. However, once a quiz has begun the timer will run. A student has 30 minutes to complete the quiz; once expired, you will not be able to continue the quiz. There are no time extensions for issues due to inadequate internet connectivity. There are no make-up quizzes; instead the lowest three quiz grades will be dropped.

Exams: During the semester we will have three mid-term exams and a final. All exam questions are multiple choice and each exam will contain approximately twenty questions. The exams will be administered through Proctor U and must be taken during the window of time given in the course calendar. The dates and times for the exams are given in the course calendar. Students will have a 24 hour period to begin an exam. However, once an exam has begun the timer will run. A student has 90 minutes to complete each midterm exam (120 minutes for the final); once expired, you will not be able to continue the exam. There are NO time extensions for issues due to inadequate internet connectivity.

A student's final grade is based upon a standard grading scale:

Please note that all tests will contain bonus points and that 50 WebAssign points will be dropped as well as three quizzes; a student's final grade is not rounded upward.

Additional Topics:

Since this is an online course, it is essential that a student keep pace with the objectives in the course calendar in order to perform well in the class. In addition to WebAssign, supplementary homework problems from the book will be assigned per lecture for additional practice as needed; it is imperative for students to complete all graded assignments in order to perform well on the exams. Academic dishonesty in any form will not be tolerated and will be treated in accordance with the policies of the University of Florida. During the course of the semester we will cover material from chapters 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16.
