

• <u>Description and Objectives of the Course</u>: This course introduces basic concepts of differential equations and presents analytical tools for solving these. Some classical applications are discussed in detail. The course covers chapters 1, 2, 4, 6, 7, and 8 (if time permits).

• <u>Grading System</u>: There is no final exam for this course. The grade is determined by the cumulative score on 4 midterms (25 points each) that are based on homework problems. The letter grade is determined according to the following table
