We will loosely follow Combinatorics: Topics, Techniques, Algorithms by Cameron.

Course Content:

Matching theory, Ramsey's theorem, lattice theory, Mobius inversion, generating functions. Polya's theorem, matroids, applications, block designs, graph theory.

Assignments & grading:

We will have (roughly) weekly homework, one in-class midterm exam and a comprehensive final exam. The homework will count for 30% of your grade. The midterm will count for 30% of your grade. The final exam will count for 40%. No scores will be dropped. Final letter grades will be assigned on a curve, which will be no tougher than the 10-point scale: 90%–100% will be some form of A, 80–90% will be at least some form of B, etc.

If you have a disagreement with the grading of one of your solutions, I ask that you submit a written request for reconsideration within one month.
