### Time and Location

### Description and Goals

Prerequisite: MAP 2302 is required. It is also desirable to have a decent understanding of a Linear Algebra course.

We will cover much of Chapters 8,9,10 and 11 of the textbook. This includes Series solutions, Matrix methods for systems, some elementary Partial Differential Equations and Eigenvalue Problems.

### Homework/Textbook

Homework will be regularly assigned. Pop quizzes will be given and all the problems in the quizzes will be very close to homework problems.

The textbook we shall use is Fundamentals of Differential Equations and Boundary Value Problems, 6th Edition, by R. Kent Nagle, Edward B. Saff and Arthur David Snider.

**Final Grades:** There will be three mid-term exams ( 20% each) and a comprehensive final exam (30%). Exams will be based upon the suggested problems. 10% of the grade will come from many pop-quizzes.

Exam 2 October 5, 2015 (mid-term)

Exam 3, November 9, 2015 (mid-term)

Exam 4 Final exam, TBA.

### A weekly schedule of topics and assignments:

Weeks 1,2,3 Chapter 8. Weeks 4,5,6 Chapter 9, Weeks 7, 8 Chapter 10. Weeks 9,10, Chapter 11 Weeks 11- Chapter 12 and possible additional topics.

### Grading Scale:
